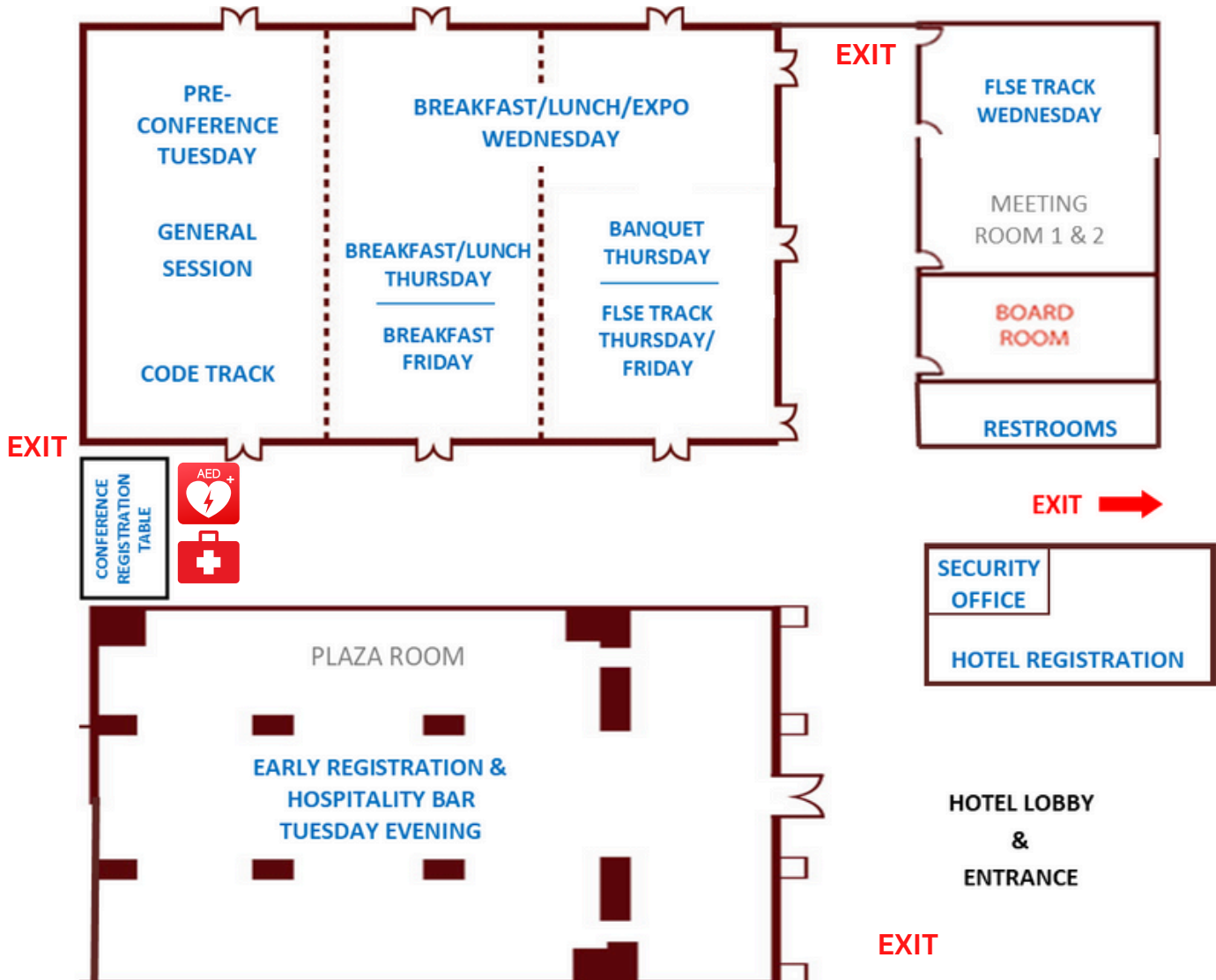

Greg Cassell, Chief (Ret.) Clark County Fire Department

This presentation will cover many aspects of the Route 91 Harvest Festival Mass Shooting that took place on the Las Vegas "Strip" on October 1st, 2017. Those in attendance will gain some insight ranging from how the attack was launched, to the response by law enforcement, fire, EMS, and hospitals to this heinous act of violence that resulted in hundreds of people injured and 60 dead. Attendees will also hear, in detail, how this night of tragedy led to the development of a new industry standard that uses local or regional response resources to assist hospitals that have been overrun by patients from a hostile mass casualty incident.

Dust Hazards Analysis: What to Expect from a DHA and Next Steps (CODES)

With the updated NFPA standards for dust explosion prevention, a Dust Hazard Analysis (DHA) is a key requirement to determine and mitigate dust hazard exposures. As the demand for the need of DHAs increases, there are many entities selling this service and claiming to meet the requirements. However, there are huge adequacy gaps in what is expected and how a DHA should be performed.

This presentation will outline how to recognize the need to complete a DHA, identify the key components of a well-completed DHA in accordance with NFPA 652, how to recognize common mistakes in a DHA report, and the key elements required/expected from a qualified DHA provider.
